Waning faith in Democracy

- ▶ Center for Politics (U of Virginia) 2021 poll shows decreased commitment to democracy (surveyed, N = 2,012):
 - Trump voters (n = 1,001)
 - Biden voters (n = 1,011)

I. The Nature of Political Belief and Cognition



What makes *political* beliefs so special, anyway?

► My foray into studying political cognition:

- Information processing:
 - Emphasizes critical thinking and reasoning capabilities.¹
- *Metacognitive failures* tell the story:
 - Unwarranted confidence in beliefs impeding the exploratory mind.²




Ideological Narratives Characterized by Value Architecture



Neural Signature of Ideological Narratives

- ▶ Brain regions processing narratives instantiating core values:⁴
- Across cultures, similar brain regions activated (Medial PFC and Anterior Cingulate Cortex) when values invoked.
- Identifying a universal neural signature for protecting values when challenged.






Why we defend our Ideological Narratives

- ▶ We mobilize our reasoning in defense of “Ersatz Religions”:⁵
 - Offers a grand life *purpose* and *identity*
 - Confers *meaning* behind personal actions
 - Immersion into like-minded *community*


...constructs that defy measurement.

The Ideologue's Gambit: Balkanization

- ▶ Symbolic boundary setting and ideological purity testing⁶
 - Ingroup and outgroup signals



Cognitive Warfare and The Politics of Fear

- Conquest of perceptions and judgments, seeking converts within population.⁷

- Ideological Narratives recursively strengthen isolation and resentment.^{8,9}






Relational Dialogue and its philosophical foundations

- ▶ Relational Dialogue, a pragmatic approach to political conflict:
 - Founded by Daryl Davis, who emphasizes:
 - Mutual Respect
 - Exploratory Posture of the Mind
 - Reciprocal Vulnerability
 - Metacognitive Sensitivity


The key tenets:





Mitigate Polarization through Relational Dialogue

- ▶ “Re-Humanize” through curiosity and connection:
 - Provoke cognitive dissonance by humanizing the interlocutor and forging genuine social bonds and connections
 - Cognitive dissonance initiates fluid and explorative reasoning¹⁰






- ▶ Take heed of the remarkable impacts of curiosity and vulnerability






Modeling political culture on the brain's exquisite wiring






